PRESS RELEASE - LNWR 'COAL TANK' 0-6-2T No. 1054's ANNIVERSARY

The LNWR 'Coal Tank' celebrates its 125th Anniversary in September 2013 having emerged from Crewe Works in September 1888 as the 250th example of a class which eventually totalled 300.

2013 also marks the 50th year in which it has been in the possession of the National Trust as the very first standard gauge steam loco to be saved for preservation as a result of a public appeal and also the 40th year in which it has been in the care of the Bahamas Locomotive Society (BLS)

19/20 October – Keighley & Worth Valley Railway

CT125 rounds off in style on the KWVR on 19/20 October when the engine will be hauling a series of special trains with vintage stock.

Arrangements are being made for the BLS to be presented with the Institute of Mechanical Engineer's prestigious Engineering Heritage Award. This award was established to celebrate excellence in mechanical engineering and increase public awareness of the engineering profession both past and present.
